# 591-1-1-.08 Children's Records

Center staff will develop a plan that includes how to obtain all required information for currently enrolled children and how to ensure this is done for future enrollees as well. ### 591-1-1-.25 Physical Plant - Safe Environment(CR)

#### Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that two air vents located in the floor of the infant classroom was rusting. Additionally, three air vents located in the floor of the infant classroom was rusting.

### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center director will ensure the above listed hazards are repaired or replaced.

### 591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

#### Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the front right, back left and back right single gates on the playground was rusting. Additionally, several areas throughout the fence are rusting.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

#### Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that the following hazards exist on the playground.

One and two-year-old playground:

---Ten of twelve swing chains are rusting.

---Ten of twelve S hooks are rusting.

---A green, beige, red and purple little tikes playhouse is missing the front door leaving two holes the size of a nickle causing a potential entrapment or pinching hazards.

Three and four-year-old playground:

---Four of four handlebars on the four seat springy see saw was chipping paint.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

### 591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

#### Finding

591-1-1-.07(5) requires Center Staff to not permit children to wear around their necks or attach to their clothing pacifiers or other hazardous items. It was determined based on observation, that a four-month-old infant was in the crib with a bib around the infant's neck.

### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will instruct Staff regarding this safety requirement.

#### Finding

591-1-1-.17(11) requires that containers used for the storage of disposable and non-disposable items such as diapers, washcloths and bed linens be: leak proof or have a leak proof disposable liner, covered, easily cleaned and maintained so contents are not accessible to the children. It was determined based on observation that a trash can was located in the bathroom of the two-year-old room with wet dirty wash clothes and accessible to the children with no trash can lid as required.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide the required number and type of containers and will provide instruction regarding the use, cleaning and storage of the containers.
