However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.08(7) requires the Center to ensure that children are only released to authorized person(s), and that Center Staff take necessary steps to determine that any such person(s) presenting to pick up a child in care is authorized by the Parent(s) of the child and that person matches the identifying information provided by the Parent. It was determined based on an investigation that center staff failed to ensure that children were only released to an authorized person on August 12, 2019, when a four-year-old child was released to an individual who was not authorized to receive them. The child was released to the unauthorized person at approximately 2:20 p.m. and was was returned to the center by the unauthorized person at approximately 5:30 p.m.

### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop/maintain procedures for releasing children and will train Staff.
