- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- · Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.03(1) requires the Center to provide a daily planned program of varied and developmentally appropriate activities to promote social, emotional, physical, cognitive, language and literacy growth. Center Staff shall use a variety of teaching methods to accommodate the needs of the children's different learning styles. It was determined based on staff statements and interviews that one or two children are allowed in the kitchen area after nap time to assist with drying dishes as a life skills activity, but this activity is not included in the lesson plan as a planned learning experience as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure all planned learning experiences are developmentally appropriate.

591-1-1-.25 Physical Plant - Safe Environment(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.25(7) requires that doors to rooms not approved for child care, other than the kitchen doors, be latched or locked so children cannot wander into those areas. Except in School-age Centers, interior Center door locks shall permit Personnel to open the locked room from outside of the room in an emergency. It was determined based on staff statements and interviews that enrolled children are occasionally allowed access into the unlicensed living room space of the home to watch movies when weather does not permit for the children to go outside. Additionally, staff statements and interviews revealed that an unlicensed bedroom of the home and the center office has been used for virtual learning and are not currently licensed for center use.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check that doors to unapproved rooms remain latched or locked and that Staff can open the locked rooms in an emergency. Additionally, center staff will ensure children are only present in licensed areas of the home. An amendment request has been submitted to add an additionally classroom space for Virtual Learning.

Food Service

591-1-1-.18 Kitchen Operations

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.18(12) prohibits children from being in the kitchen except as part of a planned, supervised learning experience. It was determined based on staff statements and interviews that one or two children are allowed in the kitchen area to assist with drying dishes while no cooking is being done after nap time as a life skills activity, but it is not included in the lesson plan as a planned, supervised learning experience as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that children's access to the kitchen is restricted unless it is part of a planned, supervised learning experience.
