- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

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Summary Report

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on consultant's investigation that on December 5, 2019 at 10:47am, a child was left un-supervised in a classroom, while the rest of the class was outside was substantiated. Staff statements and interviews revealed that on Thursday, December 5, 2019 a staff member left a four-year-old child un-supervised in the classroom at approximately 1:47 a.m. Staff interviews and statements revealed that the staff member did not adequately use the Tadpoles system to record a name to face while transitioning to outside time. Staff statements revealed that the child went in to the restroom unknowingly by the staff member and the classroom staff member and children transitioned to outside play area. Staff statements and interviews revealed the child sustained no marks, bruises or injuries during this time. Staff statements and interviews the staff member has been terminated at this time. Staff statements and interviews the staff member has been terminated at this time. Staff statements and interviews the parents were immediately notified of the incident. The consultant conducted a walk through of the facility and observed adequate supervision on this date. This allegation was substantiated.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
