- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. It was determined based on a review of records that the arrival and departure times for transportation during the week of October 14, 2019 for the S.L. Mason P.M. route were not documented on Friday, October 18, 2019. Additionally, the arrival and departure times were not documented for the weeks of September 9, 2019, September 16, 2019, September 23, 2019 and September 30, 2019 as required.

It was determined based on a review of transportation documentation that on Friday, October 18, 2019, there was no first check signature documented on the P.M. transportation checklist for the S.L. Mason route. Additionally, there was no first check signature documented on the September 3, 2019 Pinevale and Moulton Branch P.M. route transportation checklists.

Finding 591-1-132(1) requires the Center to maintain the required Staff:child ratios as follows: under 1 year or under 18 months if not walking = 1:6; 1 year and walking = 1:8; 2 years = 1:10; 3 years = 1:15; 4 years = 1:18; 5 years = 1:20; and 6 years and older = 1:25. A Center must establish groupings of children for care with maximum group sizes as follows: under 1 year = 12; under 18 months/not walking = 12; 1 year and walking = 16; 2 years = 20; 3 years = 30; 4 years = 36; 5 years = 40; and 6 years and older = 50. It was determined based on observation that in the toddler classroom there were 4 one-year-olds and 4 two-year-olds and no staff present. The ratio was 0:8 and should have been 1:8, one staff supervising the eight children. The Director was in the infant room and was observing children in the toddler classroom via a camera feed on their phone but was not present in the classroom.

Finding 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on observation that four one-year-olds and four two-year-olds were not supervised during nap time in the toddler classroom. The children were being supervised via video feed observed on a phone by a staff member who was in the infant classroom.
