- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- · Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

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Summary Report

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined during an investigation that on April 11, 2019 a three year old child was left on the playground for approximately 2-5 minutes after his class transitioned inside.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times. Staff were provided training on April 17, 2019. Ongoing training will be provided by the Extended Day Director and she will conduct classroom observations to ensure adequate supervision. The program will use a roster to conduct name to face checks every time a child transitions outside of the classroom.
