591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the fence on the right side of the playground behind the blue metal swing structure measured 3 feet and 7 inches on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high. The center will rake away the sand that has accumulated at the bottom of the fence to ensure the required fence height is met.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed on the playground on this date:

- -edges of the concrete pad in front of the door was broken and uneven and posed a tripping hazard -mushrooms were observed in the ground on the back left corner of the playground
- an accumulation of sticky gumball seeds were observed in several areas of the playground

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground. The center will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards. The center can add sand around the concrete pad outside the door to ensure the concrete slab is flush and no jagged edges are exposed.

It was determined based on observation that children in both classrooms did not wash their hands before lunch.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff on required handwashing for children and Staff will ensure children's hands are washed when required. The Director will monitor for compliance.
