Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observations, a potential entrapment hazard was observed at the back gate. A gap measuring seven to eight inches was observed at the bottom of the gate.

The fence separating the licensed playground from the unlicensed area was less than four feet. The fence measured at three feet eight inches on this date. The fence was observed to lean as there was no top post on the fence.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation, that several potential hazards were observed on the playground. The following hazards were observed on this date.

- **Seven to eight inch gaps were observed on all decks leading the playground. The gaps were observed at the stairs leading to down to the playground.
- **A one foot gap was observed at the bottom of the deck near Classroom D (Back Right).
- **The Consultant ivy growing on the playground near the deck leading from Classroom D (Back Right) and near the dividing fence directly behind the building.
- **Several exposed tree roots near the stairs leading from Classroom D (Back Right) causing a potential tripping hazard.
- **The concrete pad on a playground would need to be flushed with the ground to prevent a tripping hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.
