Comments

This Licensing study is the first regulatory visit for The YMCA A. V. Kennedy Learning Center this 2019 - 2020 fiscal year.

The center director stated the center is waiting for their Quality Rated Observation to renew their Quality Rating.

The center director stated medication is administered, one field trips has been provided since the consultant's last visit and no routine transportation is provided.

The consultant reviewed all staff files and finds that each staff member has a SAT COMP fingerprint criminal records clearance determination letter on file. The center director stated five new staff has been hired since the consultants last visit.

- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding 591-1-125(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on the consultants observation that one electric plug located in the dramatic play area in classroom F had been capped over however, there was a hole the size of a dime in the sheet rock posing as an entrapment hazard to the three and four-year-old children. Additionally, the black carpet rug was observed to be pulling away from the top and bottom of the porch screen door on the left.

Finding 591-1-126(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that on the smaller playground there were twenty-six (26) fence bolts that protruded more than the required two threads in length. On the big playground by the gate two of the cut bolts were sharp and posed a scratching hazard to children in care. Additionally, in the back left hand corner the small wooden fence was missing a slat on the right hand side creating a gap in the fence that measured five inches in width.

It was determined based on the consultants observation that dirt had washed away from the bottom f the fenced drain leaving a two inch gap around the bottom of the chain link and causing an entrapment hazard for all children while on the playground.

591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on the consultants observation that one of two Little Tykes coupe cars was missing the sterring wheel leaving a broken black piece of PVC pipe with jagged edges. Additionally, one of two Little Tykes coupe cars was chewed on the door leaving the edge of the door to have sharp edges. Additionally, three white balls located on the octagon shaped equipment was broken and had sharp edges.

Finding 591-1-114(3) requires the Center to have a first aid kit in each building of the Center and in any vehicle used by the Center for transportation of children, that contains scissors, tweezers, gauze pads, adhesive tape, thermometer, band-aids, assorted sizes, antibacterial ointment, insect-sting preparation, an antiseptic cleansing solution, triangular bandages, rubber gloves, protective eye wear, a protective face mask, and a cold pack. The first aid kit, together with a first aid instruction manual which must be kept with the kit at all times, shall be stored so that it is not accessible to children but is easily accessible to Staff. It was determined based on the consultants observation that the first aid kit was missing the goggles. Additionally, the tube of anti-septic expired March of 2011. Additionally, the tube of anti-bacterial ointment expired January of 2018. Additionally, the tube of insect sting expired April of 2013.
