This Monitoring Visit is the second regulatory visit for The YMCA A.V. Kennedy Learning Center this 2019 - 2020 fiscal year.

The center director stated two new staff has been hired since the consultants last visit. The consultant reveiwed all staff files and finds that each staff member has a satisfactory comprehensive finger print criminal records clearance determination letter on file as required. The center director stated no field trips or routine transportation has been provided since the consultants last visit. Medication has been administered.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that a 19 oz. spray can of Clorox Disinfectant labeled keep out of the reach of children was stored in a cabinet under the handwashing sink in the four-year-old classroom, accessible to the children. Additionally, the safety latch to the cabinet in which the Clorox was stored was broken.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Correction Deadline: 2/28/2020

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that the yellow tape located in the two-year-old classroom, outlining a game of hop scotch, was freyed and accessible to the children. Additionally, one safety latch located under the handwashing sink in the four-year-old classroom was broken and not latching properly.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that one electrical outlet located in the two-year-old classroom located under the green paper towel dispenser and fan did not have the protective covering as required. Additionally one electrical outlet located in the three-year-old classroom by the last window on the left did not have the protective covering as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to check outlets and replace protective caps when needed and identify and monitor how outlets in use are inaccessible to children.
