- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. It was determined based on observation that there were four active ant beds on the right side playground. It was further determined that there were eight active ant beds and bees on the left side playground on this date. It was further determined that there was a nail protruding from the base of the metal awning and a two and a half inch gap from the ground to the base of the metal awning on this date.

Only the current day's formula or breast milk shall be served. If formula must be provided by the Center, only commercially prepared, ready-to-feed formula shall be used. Refrigerated or frozen breast milk shall only be heated or thawed under warm running water or in a container of warm water. It was determined based on staff statement and observation that three cans of powdered formula were observed in the classroom. Staff stated that bottles are prepared at the center instead of being ready to feed as required.

Finding 591-1-136(3)(a-b) requires any Center that provides any type of transportation to obtain two (2) hours of state-approved or state-accepted transportation training, biannually, for the Director and for each person responsible for or who participates in the transportation of children. The training shall include, but is not limited to, a review of the transportation rules, a review of approved transportation forms and procedures, and instruction on the usage and completion of the forms and procedures. This training may be counted as part of the annual training requirements for Staff. It was determined based on review of records that Staff #12, 14, and 17 did not have current evidence of completing the two hour transportation every two years as required.

Finding 591-1-136(4)(b) requires that the interior of a transportation vehicle be clean, in safe repair and free of hazardous items, objects and/or other non-essential items which could cause injury. It was determined that the following hazards were observed on the brown van (vehicle tag RKD8831) used for routine transportation: -Five bottles of antifreeze, a bottle of brake fluid, jumper cables, and three bottles of motor oil were stored in the back of the van accessible to children There were tears in the upholstery of the second and fourth seats of the van, and the inner foam was exposed and accessible to childrenThere were tears in the upholstery of the armrest of the first row of seats and the inner foam was exposed and accessible to childrenThe rear passenger door was inoperable and could not be opened from the interior or the exterior of the van.

It was determined based on consultant's observation that there was no fire extinguisher in the brown van used for routine transportation with vehicle tag number RKD8831 on this date.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(a) requires that each vehicle contains current information including: the full names of all children to be transported, each child's pick-up location, pick-up time, delivery location, alternate delivery location if a Parent is not at home and name of person authorized to receive each child. In addition, the vehicle shall contain current information identifying the Center's name, telephone number and the name of the driver of the vehicle. It was determined based on review of records that the arrival and departure times to and from the center were not documented during routine transportation for Willis Foreman Elementary School, Dorothy Haines Elementary School, Wheeless Road Elementary School, Jamestown Elementary School, Diamond Lakes Elementary School, Spirit Creek Elementary School, Glenn Hills Elementary School, and Glenn Hills Middle School the week of August 12, 2019 and the week of August 19, 2019.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(c)2. requires that the driver or other designated person shall immediately document in writing, with a check or other mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist each time a child enters and exits the vehicle. The driver or other designated staff person shall document in writing with a different mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist who was not present on the vehicle for any reason. An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based on review of records that the load and unload of children was not documented during routine transportation on August 12, 2019 to and from Wheelees Road Elementary.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(d)1. requires that the first check be conducted immediately upon unloading the last child at any ocation including, but not limited to, a field trip destination, arrival at the Center, and the last stop during ransportation to home or school. The responsible person on the vehicle shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's nterior; sign the passenger transportation checklist (s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle; and give the passenger transportation checklist(s) to the second designated Staff person. It was determined based on review of records that the first check of the vehicle was not documented for morning and afternoon routine transportation to and from A. Bryanmerry Elementary School on August 16, 2019.

Finding 591-1-136(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle mmediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk hrough the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on a review of records that a second check of the vehicle was not documented during the week of August 12, 2019 to and from A. Bryanmerry Elementary School, Willis Foreman Elementary School, Jamestown Elementary School, Diamond Lakes Elementary School, Spirit Creek Elementary School, Glenn Hills Elementary School, and Glenn Hills Middle School.

591-1-136(8) restricts a child's travel time to forty-five minutes on each trip between the Center and destination unless accompanied by the Parent and excluding field trips. It was determined based on review of records that children's travel time exceeded 45 minutes for routine transportation during the week of August 12, 2019 for Jamestown Elementary School, Glenn Hills Middle School, Glenn Hills Elementary School, and Diamond Lakes Elementary School. It was further determined that children's travel time exceeded 45 minutes for routine transportation during the week of August 19, 2019 for Dorothy Haines Elementary School, Wheeless Road Elementary School, Willis Foreman Elementary School, Diamond Lakes Elementary School, Spirit Creek Elementary School, Glenn Hills Elementary, and Glenn Hills Middle School.

It was determined based on a review of records that Staff #19 did not submit both a Records Check Application to the Department and Fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site as required.	

Finding 591-1-1-.09(1)(c) requires the Center to ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on a review of records that Staff # 19 did not have a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file on this date.
