If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding 591-1-114(2) requires a Staff member who is trained in CPR and first aid to be on the premises and on any field trip whenever any child is present. In addition, Staff who provide direct care to children must satisfactorily obtain certification in first aid and CPR by December 29, 2016 if employed prior to September 30, 2016 and within 90 days of their hire date if employed after September 30, 2016. It was determined, based on review of records, that four of nineteen staff hired in July, 2017, did not have evidence of completing first aid and CPR training within 90 days of their hire date. It was further determined that three of nineteen staff hired in July and September 2017 did not have evidence of completing hands-on CPR training as required.

Finding 591-1-133(3) requires each staff member with direct care responsibilities to complete health and safety training at the time of employment that will count toward required annual training: Staff employed prior to September 30, 2016 will complete the training by December 29, 2016 and Staff employed after September 30, 2016 will complete the health and safety training within the first 90 days of employment. It was determined, based on review of records, that nineteen staff hired in July and September 2017 were lacking documentation of completing the Health and Safety Orientation training as required.

591-1-131(11) requires the Center to have qualified and sufficient direct-care, clerical, housekeeping, maintenance and other employees to ensure full compliance with these rules without neglecting the supervision of children. It was determined, based on observation, that one staff was present caring for eighteen children present in the front classroom of Building 1 and also stepping into the kitchen to prepare breakfast when other staff were required to ensure the supervision of children was not neglected.

Finding 591-1-132(2) requires the Center maintain Staff:child ratios in mixed-age groups based on the age of the youngest group of children that includes more than twenty percent of the total number of children in the mixed-age group. It was determined, based on observation, that one staff was observed providing care to two infants, three one-year-old children, one two-year-old child, three three-year-old children, one four-year-old child, and eight children aged six and over when three staff were required.

Finding 591-1-132(4) requires that children under three years old be housed in separate physical areas from older children and cannot be mixed with older children except at specified times and circumstances. It was determined, based on observation, that children under three-years-old were being housed with older children in the front classroom of Building 1 on this date.

Finding 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined, based on observation, that the one staff present providing care to eighteen children in the front classroom of Building 1 was observed to step into the kitchen several times to prepare breakfast for children present, leaving children unsupervised.
