591-1-1-.12(4) requires that equipment and furniture is secured if it is of a weight or mass that could cause injury from tipping, falling, or being pulled or pushed over. It was determined based on observation, the tall shelf in the back of Classroom C was observed unsecured posing as a possible tipping hazard.

Discussed maintenance of resilient surface. Please fluff and redistribute. The resilient surface was wet and somewhat packed down from the recent rain. A supervision plan was discussed and created for the route to the playground. The playground approximately 257 feet from the building. The center uses orange cones to block all driveways when children are exiting the building to walk to the playground area.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observations, large pieces of chipping paint was observed on the large climbing equipment on Playground A and B.

The center will need to remove or rearrange the portable equipment on Playground A.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

591-1-1-.10(2) requires Centers first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that renovate existing plumbing facilities, to have a hand washing sink with running heated water located adjacent to the diapering area. Flush sinks shall not be used for hand washing. Cleansing procedures in other facilities shall be approved by the Department. It was determined based on observation the sink for diapering in Classroom A, B, and D was not adjacent to the changing table. The changing table in Classroom D was located on opposite wall. The sink for Classroom A and B was located inside the bathrooms and not in the classroom.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that a hand washing sink is located adjacent to each diapering area, that flush sinks are not used for handwashing, and that the department has approved cleansing procedures in other facilities, if applicable.
