- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.03(7) requires the center to provide outdoor activities daily, weather permitting. It was determined based on statement that the children have not had outdoor play since August 2018 due to construction of an addition to the building.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The cCenter will follow a schedule that allows for all children to have the required amount of daily outside play time.

The center will add a temporary barrier to the outside playground, stager the outside times for classes and reflect that on their daily schedules so children can get the required time. The center will ensure that if the play equipment on that side is not age appropriate that age appropriate toys are taken out for the children temporarily until they can return to their intended playground.

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on consultant's observation that the fencing dividing the two playgrounds was removed in areas for construction and poses hazards to children in care.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add a barrier to enclose the gaps.

Technical Assistance

Consultant discussed that all hazardous items need to be removed from the playground before children's outside time. Consultant discussed that construction tools and items need to be in an area inaccessible.

The center is undergoing construction to add another building. The center children at the current time have not had access to the items in that they have not had outside time. Consultant discussed that the children get the needed outside time, and to have a temporary barrier for the playground.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(3) requires baby bottles and formula to be labeled with the individual child's name; supplied by the Parent daily in bottles; and refrigerated at a temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or less. Only the current day's formula or breast milk shall be served. If formula must be provided by the Center, only commercially prepared, ready-to-feed formula shall be used. Refrigerated or frozen breast milk shall only be heated or thawed under warm running water or in a container of warm water. It was determined based on consultant observation that an infants bottles were not pre made as the parents brought bottles and power formula for the center staff to make for the child.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to follow the required procedures, ensure that parents are fully informed, and will review and monitor regularly.

Freezer temperature shall be maintained at zero (0) degrees Fahrenheit or below. It was determined based on consultant observation that the refrigerator in the infant classroom was reading approximately 55 degree Fahrenheit on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will refrigerate foods as required, will train Staff on proper refrigerator and freezer temperature settings and monitor the settings. Food will be served promptly after cooking.

591-1-1-.14(3) requires the Center to have a first aid kit in each building of the Center and in any vehicle used by the Center for transportation of children, that contains scissors, tweezers, gauze pads, adhesive tape, thermometer, band-aids, assorted sizes, antibacterial ointment, insect-sting preparation, an antiseptic cleansing solution, triangular bandages, rubber gloves, protective eye wear, a protective face mask, and a cold pack. The first aid kit, together with a first aid instruction manual which must be kept with the kit at all times, shall be stored so that it is not accessible to children but is easily accessible to Staff. It was determined based on consultant observation that a first aid kit in Room B was accessible to children in care in that it was hanging on hooks by the classroom window within reach of enrolled children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center Staff will provide any missing first aid kits, add any missing items to each first aid kit and will develop and use a plan for checking the kits and replacing missing items in each kit in the future. First aid kits and instruction manuals will be stored so that they kits are not accessible to children but are easily accessible to Center Staff.
