If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

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591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the metal fence measured three feet nine inches on the upper left side of the playground near the school-age slide and the metal fence measured three feet eight inches on the back right corner near the red dome of the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The rust will be removed by spray painting the panels and a cap and or tape will be used to cover the pole missing caps. Consultant observed that the wooden had been replaced on this date.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that there was uneven surfacing between the hard and soft surfacing creating a potential tripping hazard near the left side of the playground near the wooden fence. It was further determined that a metal pole with sharp edges protruded on top of the ground creating a potential tripping hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards. The following hazards were in compliance on this date:the grass was cut, exposed tree roots were painted and the play area with excesses tree roots will not be used. The uneven surfacing between the hard and soft surfacing will be enclosed to create a smooth transition as the children play. The peeling paint, splintered stairs and railing leading to the playground will be repaired and or removed to use previous concrete stairs.

591-1-1-.36(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on review of records that on November 12, 2018, staff failed to provide documentation of a second check after routine transportation to Rowland Elementary, Terry Mill Elementary, Peachcrest Elementary, Dekalb Elementary School of Arts and Avondale Elementary.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff who are or may be involved in transporting children in how to thoroughly inspect a vehicle and properly complete transportation documentation. The Center will review and monitor.

It was determined based on observation that an infant was asleep in a car safety seat.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will only place infants in safe cribs to sleep and will transfer them to a safe crib when the infants are asleep in other equipment.
