- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Technical Assistance

591-1-1-.11(1) - The consultant discussed with the director the use of time-out as a form of discipline for two-year-old children, as one staff stated during staff interviews that the known biter was placed in time-out after the biting incident in the block area on August 28, 2020. The use of time-out as a form of discipline should not be used for children under three-years-old. Positive redirection and discussion should be used for all children as forms of discipline.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined, based on investigative findings, that on August 28, 2020, watchful oversight was not provided when staff did not prevent a two-year-old child with known biting behaviors from biting more than three children several times in one day. It was further determined that there was a lack of supervision when one child playing with Lego Duplo blocks on the rug was observed on video footage to hit another child on the head multiple times with a Lego Duplo block and was not redirected.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
