Corrected during the visit and should be monitored:

Playground A: heavy duty tape placed on gap in PVC pipe border around the two swings, around the wire accessible from the electrical pole, and a hole at the back of the yellow metal stationary car. A five-inch gap in the fencing at the front left corner of the playground was corrected using zip ties to tighten the fencing. Exposed roots were spray painted with a bright color, and any zip ties used on fencing were cut and smoothed down. Discussed monitoring for ant beds each day prior to children going outside, and sanding any cut bolts on the fencing that may have sharp edges. Also suggested securing the fencing or adding a board or other material to the outside of the fencing at the fencing along West Street, to prevent the fence from being pushed out at the bottom.

Playground B: Discussed removing any limbs coming through the fencing along the back of the playground and maintaining fencing free of limbs, bushes and vines.
