- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Further, consultant stated to center director/owner, that prior to providing transportation and/or field trips, the center is required to contact the assigned Bright from the Start: Regional Consultant, to discuss and review all transportation and field trip requirements.
