The purpose of today's visit was to conduct a follow up to a visit conducted on February 12, 2021 and to conduct a complaint investigation. Investigative findings were not concluded on this date. Once investigative findings have been concluded by the assigned Child Care Consultant, the provider will be notified of any findings. The complaint investigation remains open at this time. The Child Care Consultant completing today's visit has provided their business card with complete contact information. Please contact the visiting consultant if there are any individuals affiliated the CCLC diagnosed with COVID-19 in the next 14 days after the visit has taken place. Affiliated individuals may include, but are not limited to the provider, household members, children in care, and family members of children in care. The current Executive Order was utilized during today's visit and the provider demonstrated compliance with the current order. Consultant reviewed pictures taken of playground tripping hazards with center director on this date.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

591-1-1-.33 Staff Training

Finding

591-1-1-.33(3) requires each Staff member with direct care responsibilities to complete health and safety orientation training within the first 90 days of employment. The state-approved training hours obtained will count toward required first year training hours. The training must address the following health and safety topics: prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunizations); prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices; administration of medication, consistent with standards for parental consent; prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions; building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards that can cause bodily injury such as electrical hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic; prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment; emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies resulting from a natural disaster or a human-caused event (such as violence at a child care facility); handling and storage of hazardous materials and the appropriate disposal of bio contaminants; precautions in transporting children; recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect; and child development. It was determined based on a review of records that staff #6 whose hire date was January 19, 2021 did not have a completed health and safety training within 90 days as required. The center's administrator acknowledge the staff did on have the required training on the date of the follow up.
