- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

It was determined based on observation that there were five unsecured computer monitors in room B, and there was an unsecured screen on a shelf in room A.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation and measurements, that the fence facing the parking lot on the right side of the building measured at three feet and 10 inches, when at least four feet is required. Additionally, it was determined that plastic lattice fence was used, which is not approved material.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will replace the lattice fence with wooden privacy fence that is at least four feet high and non-hazardous for the children.

It was determined based on review of records, that the driver, who is also the only staff on the bus, had Transportation Training that had expired in March, 2019.
