- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding

591-1-1-.06(1) requires the center to provide a specified minimum number of flush toilets and hand washing sinks with running water for the use of all children, at least one flush toilet for children. It was determined based on Consultant's observation that only one (1) working toilet was present in the facility for children's use, when two (2) are required for the licensed capacity of the facility.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Per the director/owner the facility will remove one of the sinks in the bathroom and add an additional toilet. Further a partition will be added in between the toilets to ensure children have privacy as required by rule. 7/20/20 Consultant reviewed email with attachment showing an additional toilet was added and operable via video. The capacity of the center is (24) twenty-four children based on the number of toilets and sinks.

Correction Deadline: 8/1/2020

Finding

591-1-1-.06(4) requires a Center first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that remodel or add to existing plumbing facilities, to have the bathroom area fully enclosed and ventilated to the outside of the building with either an open screened window or functioning exhaust fan and duct system and requires Centers without fully enclosed bathrooms to ensure there is adequate ventilation to control odors and adequate sanitation measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. It was determined based on Consultant's observation the exhaust fan wasn't functioning properly. It failed the tissue test.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will fully enclose and ventilate bathroom areas, as required, and will provide adequate ventilation and sanitation in bathrooms that are not fully enclosed. The exhaust fan will be repaired and or replaced.

591-1-1-.25(17) requires that the Center premises be free of plants and shrubs which are poisonous or hazardous. It was determined based on observation vegetation and thorny plants were growing through the back and left side fencing.

The harmful item will be removed.

591-1-1-.25(6) - Classroom A and B use hooks for individual cubbie space for the children. Classroom A needs seven (7) additional hooks and classroom B needs eight (8) additional hooks to support the overall licensed capacity of the facility.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on Consultant's observation rust spots were observed on the fence clamps and gate latches.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use. All rust spots and vegetation will be removed.

Correction Deadline: 7/2/2020

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on Consultant's observation the following hazards on the equipment:

- -Exposed concrete at the bottom of the pink and blue spinners.
- -Worn and broken boards on the base of the pink/blue activity truck.
- An open space that would allow the children to climb thru accessible to the children.
- -Rust on the screws.
- -Playground lacked a variety of toys/equipment.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters. The exposed concrete will be covered with mulch, open space enclosed with a board to make inaccessible and screws painted to remove rust. The playground does not contain climbing equipment/swings. The program will be utilizing portable equipment, such as hula-hoops, balls, riding cars, bikes, and will have planned activities for the children to participate in.

Correction Deadline: 7/12/2020

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on Consultant's observation the following hazards were observed in the outside play space:

- Mushrooms were present in the play space.
- Exposed tree roots
- -High grass
- Large rocks
- Cracked gutter routers
- Two large protruding nails on the left side of the border surrounding the play area
- -Low hanging tree branches
- -Active ants in the grass

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove all hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards. The grass and hanging tree branches will be cut, remove all mushrooms and large rock, cracked gutters will be replaced, protruding nail will be hammered down into the border and the playground will be treated for ants.

- -A statement allowing Parent(s) access to all child care areas upon notifying any staff member of his or her presence.
- -Names of persons responsible for the administration of the Center in the administrator's absence.
- -Date current week's menu for meals and snacks.
- -A statement requiring visitors to check in with Staff when entering the Center.
- -Notice provided by the Department which advises Parents of their right to review a copy of the Center's most recent licensure evaluation report upon request to the Center Director.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that sheets are marked for individual use or washed daily and that marked sheets are washed at least weekly.

Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(b)4 requires that a light cover be available for each child's use on a cot or mat and shall be marked for individual use or laundered daily. If marked for individual use, they must be laundered weekly or more frequently if needed. It was determined based on Consultant's observation Room A lacked eleven covers and room B will add (12) twelve covers to meet the licensed capacity.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that a light cover is available for each child and will meet the requirements for laundering.
