- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance

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Summary Report

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on investigative findings that on December 12, 2022, staff members failed to provide watchful oversight when a three-year-old child sustained scratches on the neck and a bruise on the nose. Investigative findings and review of the incident report dated for December 12, 2022, revealed that the child sustained a scratch to the face due to being hit on the head by another child. While staff statements and interviews revealed how the incident occurred, staff statements and interviews were conflicting regarding what injuries were sustained at the time of the incident and how the remaining injuries were sustained. No medical attention was received for the scratches and/or bruise.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times. Upon completing an internal investigation of the December 12, 2022 incident, the center management team took immediate action and created an action plan for staff members A, B, and C that required each staff member to be retrained on communication, exit reports, and supervision. Furthermore, staff members A, B, and C were required to review the center classroom supervision policy with the center management team.
