- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on consultant's observation that the fence gate located on Playground B had a four and a half inch gap between the bottom of the gate and the ground. Additionally, a fence pole on Playground A contained an exposed concrete footing at the base of the pole.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will add additional fencing material to the gate on Playground B to lessen the gap at the bottom. The center will cover the exposed concrete footing so that it is no longer a hazard.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on consultant's observation that the resilient surfacing in the fall zone of the monkey bars located on Playground B measured three inches in depth when the requirement is six inches.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones of the monkey bars and monitor daily to ensure that adequate resilient surfacing is present at all times.
