Comments

A virtual initial licensing visit and exit conference was conducted on March 9, 2021. An administrative review of staff background checks was conducted this date. An in-person visit was not conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A copy of the Executive Order issued on February 15, 2021 and the COVID-19 checklist was discussed, and copies emailed to the provider. The provider did not have liability insurance and had the required posting.

The program is currently on a temporary license awaiting submission of a recent fire marshal inspection, septic inspection and updated zoning and building codes documents. The temporary license expires May 20, 2021.

5/17/21 - All required documents were received and the program was issued a final license this date. The fire marshal inspection dated 5/4/21 limited the capacity to 56.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance.
