- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

You have received permission to operate and the form received with this report is intended to serve as a temporary license which is valid for thirty(30) days. Facility

591-1-1-.06 Bathrooms Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.06(4) requires a Center first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that remodel or add to existing plumbing facilities, to have the bathroom area fully enclosed and ventilated to the outside of the building with either an open screened window or functioning exhaust fan and duct system and requires Centers without fully enclosed bathrooms to ensure there is adequate ventilation to control odors and adequate sanitation measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. It was determined based on observation that the children's restrooms did not have an exhaust fan as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ventilate bathroom areas, as required, or will submit a variance for this rule by the date specified.

Hazardous Items such as hand sanitizer, medicine bottles and teacher supplies such as scissors, hole punch and stapler were moved out of reach of children and will be stored out of reach.

Comment

The following was corrected and maintenance was discussed: small exposed roots were sprayed with a bright colored paint to prevent tripping. Any roots that were loose from the ground will be pulled up. The water hose was removed and will be secured to the building to prevent tripping hazards when used on the playground. Bolts on the chain link fence were turned so they did not protrude towards the playground, and the mulch was added around the bottom of fencing surrounding the A/C units so gaps and exposed cement were no longer present. The equipment will be monitored for chipping paint.

Health and Hygiene

There were currently no diapered children enrolled in the program. A diapering plan is in place in the event that a child with this need is enrolled.

Finding

591-1-1-17(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined based on observation that there was not warm water at sinks in the classrooms or in the children's restrooms.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will apply for a variance for warm water in children's restrooms and classrooms by the date specified. The staff restroom and the kitchen sinks have warm water.

In addition, prior to providing transportation, the regional consultant will be contacted to discuss and review all transportation requirements.

Sleeping & Resting Equipment

591-1-1-.30 Safe Sleeping and Resting Requirements(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(b)1 requires that cots and mats are of sound construction and of sufficient size to accommodate comfortably the size and weight of the child; and that mats are in good repair, washable, covered with a waterproof material and at least two inches (2") thick. It was determined based on observation that some of the mats used by the three and four-year-old children were only 1 inch thick. In addition, the mats used by the 5-year-old children in Rooms C and D were made of fabric, were not at least 2 inches thick and were not covered with a waterproof material.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that cots and mats are of sound construction and of sufficient size to accommodate the size and weight of the child and mats are in good repair, washable, covered with a waterproof material and is at least two inches thick.
