- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

591-1-1-.35 Swimming Pools & Water-related Activities(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.35(3) requires the Center to maintain Staff:child ratios as follows to provide proper supervision of children engaged in swimming and water-related activities in water over two feet deep: Under 2 1/2 years = 1:2, 2 1/2 to 4 years = 1:5, 4 years and older who cannot swim a distance of 15 yards unassisted = 1:6, 4 years and older who can swim a distance of 15 yards unassisted as determined by a swimming test = 1:15. At least one qualified lifeguard must be present. Copies of certificates from a recognized water-safety class may be accepted in lieu of requiring each child to take a swimming test to determine if the child can swim 15 yards unassisted. It was determined based on review of records that swim tests and copies of lifeguard certificates were not obtained for all children who participated in a field trip to Frances Meadow's Pool on 6/28/2019, 7/5/2019 and 7/12/2019.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that adequate numbers of Staff are available to maintain the required Staff:child ratios. Staff will determine each child's swimming ability by performing a swim test and document the results of the test or will obtain copies of certificates from recognized water safety instructors for children not tested at the Center. A certified lifeguard will be present at the pool during swimming activities.

Finding

591-1-1-.35(6) requires the Parents' written permission for a child to participate in a swimming activity. It was determined based on review of records that parental written permission for swimming was not obtained for one child who participated in a field trip to Frances Meadow's pool on 7/5/2019 and 7/12/2019.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that parental permission is secured prior to a child's participation.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were present:

Playground Left: The "pour and play" rubber surfacing contains several rips and holes surrounding the play structure, causing a potential tripping hazard.

Playground Upper: The wooden benches on the playhouse with the yellow roof contain sharp splinters of wood.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(3) requires baby bottles and formula to be labeled with the individual child's name; supplied by the Parent daily in bottles; and refrigerated at a temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or less. Only the current day's formula or breast milk shall be served. If formula must be provided by the Center, only commercially prepared, ready-to-feed formula shall be used. Refrigerated or frozen breast milk shall only be heated or thawed under warm running water or in a container of warm water. It was determined based on observation that one bottle containing infant formula and one child's cup containing milk were not labeled with the child's name. Further the bottles were not refrigerated at a temperature of 40 degrees as the refrigerator had become unplugged on accident.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to follow the required procedures, ensure that parents are fully informed, and will review and monitor regularly.

A current/completed inspection was observed for all vehicles used in transporting children this date. Vehicles with tag numbers BLQ 3280 and BWE 4219 are only used for summer camp field trips. Provider does not provide routine school transportation.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(3)(a-b) requires any Center that provides any type of transportation to obtain two (2) hours of state-approved or state-accepted transportation training, biannually, for the Director and for each person responsible for or who participates in the transportation of children. The training shall include, but is not limited to, a review of the transportation rules, a review of approved transportation forms and procedures, and instruction on the usage and completion of the forms and procedures. This training may be counted as part of the annual training requirements for Staff. It was determined based on review of records that one teacher who participated in summer camp field trips did not possess the required transportation training.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that the Director, Center Staff, and any person responsible for the transportation of children has completed the required transportation training.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(c) requires that each vehicle be equipped with a fire extinguisher maintained in working order and kept inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the fire extinguishers in each of the two vehicles previously used for summer camp field trips had not been serviced since June 2015.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each vehicle has a working fire extinguisher and that the fire extinguisher is kept out of reach of children.
