- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Please see GBI's website located at http://gbi.georgia.gov to access the Georgia Sex Offender Registry.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, suclimited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined by consultant's observation that the following playground hazards were observed: -A twelve (12) inch gap was observed on the middle of bottom skirting back side of the Pre-K to the crawl space under the building accessible to the children in care. -A twenty-four (24) inch gap was observed on the right hand side bottom skirting back side of the building leaving the crawl space under the building accessible to the children in care. -A 111 inch (9 foot) gap was observed on the left hand side of the bottom skirting back side of the building leaving the crawl space under the building accessible to the children in care. -There was standing water under the A.C. Finding 591-1-136(6) requires written Parental authorization for routine transportation provided by or on Center. Written authorization must include the routine pick-up location, routine pick-up time, routi location, routine delivery times and the name of any person authorized to receive the child. It was based on a review of records that only 27 of the 38 children being transported had written authorized transported from their school to the center.	ne delivery s determined

Finding 591-1-136(7)(b) requires that an emergency medical information record be maintained in the vehicle for each child being transported. The emergency medical information record for each child shall include a listing of the child's full name, date of birth, allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications that the child is required to take on a daily basis for a chronic condition, the name and telephone number of the child's doctor, the local medical facility that the Center uses in the area where the Center is located and the telephone numbers where the Parents can be reached. It was determined based on a review of records that four of five records reviewed did not have the physician's phone number, three of five records did not have contact information for parents or the emergency pick up persons, and three of five records did not have information about the child's allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications that the child is required to take on a daily basis for a chronic condition as required.

Sleeping & Resting Equipment
591-1-130 Safe Sleeping and Resting Requirements(CR) Not Met
Finding 591-1-130(1)(a) requires a crib that is safety approved in compliance with Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society of Testing and Materials International (ASTM) safety standards be
provided for each infant. It was determined based on observation that there were nine infants in the infant classroom and only eight cribs. Staff stated that an eleven month old child was placed on a rest mat on the floor for nap and not in a crib as required.

Finding 591-1-130(1)(a)2 requires that a crib mattress is firm, tight-fitting without gaps, at least 2 inches thick and covered with a waterproof, washable material. Before a change of occupant, each mattress shall be cleaned with a disinfectant. It was determined based on observation that six of eight crib mattresses had tears in the vinyl covering that exposed the foam inside and prevented the mattresses from being waterproof and washable as required.

Corrected on 9/4/2019 .30(1)(a)3 - This citation was observed to be corrected on this date. The sheets were tight fitting but the consultant did discuss with the center about changing crib sheets more often than daily if they are dirty.
Finding
591-1-130(2) requires the Center to provide a safe sleep environment in accordance with American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) recommendations as listed in these rules for all infants. Center Staff shall place an infant to sleep on the infant's back in a crib unless the Center has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing another sleep position for that particular infant that includes how the infant shall be placed to sleep and a time frame that the instructions are to be followed. When an infant can easily turn over from back to front and back again, Staff shall continue to put the infant to sleep initially on the infant's back but allow the infant to roll over into his or her preferred position and not re-position the infant. Sleepers, sleep sacks and wearable blankets that fit according to the commercial manufacturer's guidelines and will not slide up around the infant's face may be used when necessary for the comfort of the sleeping infant. Swaddling shall not be used unless the Center has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing its use for a particular infant that includes instructions and a time frame for swaddling the infant. Center Staff shall not place objects or allow objects to be placed in or on the crib with an infant such as but not limited to toys, pillows, quilts, comforters, bumper pads, sheepskins, stuffed toys, or other soft items and shall not attach objects or allow objects to be attached to a crib with a sleeping infant, such as, but not limited to, crib gyms, toys, mirrors and mobiles. It was determined based on observation that an infant was in a crib for nap time and had a bib on around their neck and a pacifier attached to their clothes.
