Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on an investigation that there was a lack of supervision on February 19, 2018, when a one-year-old child sustained scratches and marks on the face, arm, and hand and the staff member did not know how the injuries occurred. No professional medical attention was obtained.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
