- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were present:

Playground 1:

---Two of two black handle bars located on the red springy air plane were chipping paint and rusting.

Playground 2:

- ---Two of two blue metal four seat cars were chipping paint and rusting.
- ---The red metal train was chipping paint and rusting.

Playground 3:

- ---The green metal truck with black tires was chipping paint and rusting.
- ---The blue metal truck with black tires was chipping paint and rusting.
- --- The green and yellow metal tractor was chipping paint and rusting.
- ---The blue and red metal springy see saw was chipping paint and rusting.
- --- The yellow metal climbing bars was chipping paint and rusting.
- ---The blue five seat metal merry-go-round was chipping paint and rusting.
