290-2-3-.12 Equipment and Supplies(CR)

290-2-3-.12(7) requires all indoor and outdoor furniture and equipment shall be secured if equipment and furniture is of a weight or mass that could cause injury from tipping, falling, or being pulled or pushed over. Potentially unstable equipment and furniture that might injure a child if not secured include, but are not limited to, televisions, chests of drawers, bookcases, shelving, cabinets and fish tanks. Examples of items not required to be secured include, but are not limited to, child-sized tables and chairs, rocking chairs, and cribs. It was determined equipment was secure this date.

290-2-3-.19 Infant-Sleeping Safety Requirements(CR)

Finding

290-2-3-.19(1)(a) requires that the Home shall provide either a safety approved crib or other equipment that is approved for infant sleep for each infant (any child under the age of twelve (12) months or any child who is under eighteen (18) months of age who is not walking), who cannot climb out of the crib or other approved equipment. Each crib shall be safety approved in compliance with Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society of Testing and Materials International (ASTM) safety standards; any other equipment, such as, but not limited to, a portable crib, playpen, play yard or bassinet, shall be in compliance with current ASTM Standard Consumer Safety Specifications for Non-Full-Size Baby Cribs/Play Yards. It was determined based on observation that the pack and play used for infant sleeping was not compliant in that the affixed manufacturer instructions did not indicate that the device could be used for sleeping.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will remove any noncompliant cribs and provide a safety approved crib or other equipment that is approved and in compliance with the CPSC and ASTM standards for infant sleep for each infant in care.

It was determined based on observation that the home did no have an updated emergency plan.

Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children. A fence shall be provided around swimming pools to make them inaccessible when not in use. It was determined based on observation that a gap in the fencing material was observed in the back right corner of the play area making the neighbor's yard accessible.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will enclose the outside play area(s) with a four-foot high fence or other Department-approved barrier and inspect regularly to ensure fencing material is safe and any hazards identified are repaired or replaced. Welded wire that was at least 48 inches in height was suggested.
