If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. 290-2-3-.12 Equipment and Supplies(CR)

Technical Assistance

290-2-3-.12(5) - Pleas ensure that all indoor and outdoor furniture, activity materials, and equipment shall be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint and kept clean. On this date the consultant observed a wooden structure outdoors with a sharp edge located on the left back side as well as several outside toys that were not kept clean.

290-2-3-.19 Infant-Sleeping Safety Requirements(CR)

Finding

290-2-3-.19(1)(b) requires that cots and mats shall be provided for each child who is two (2) years of age or older and who is required to take a nap and for each child under the age of two years who can climb out of a crib or other equipment approved for infant sleep. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that a child who is two(2) years of age was observed sleeping in a pack in play instead of a mat or a cot.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will provide a cot or mat for every child who is 2 years of age or older and every child who is under the age of 2 year who is able to climb out of a crib.

Finding

290-2-3-.19(2) requires that a Family Child Care Learning Home shall provide a safe sleep environment in accordance with American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) recommendations as listed in these rules for all infants and one-year-old children when placed for sleep in a safety approved crib or in any other type of equipment approved for infant sleep. Staff shall place an infant to sleep on the infant's back unless the Parent has provided a physician's written statement authorizing another sleep position for that particular infant that includes how the infant shall be placed to sleep and a time frame that the instructions are to be followed. When an infant can easily turn over from back to front and back again. Staff shall continue to put the infant to sleep initially on the infant's back, but allow the infant to roll over into his or her preferred positions and not re-position the infant. Sleepers, sleep sacks and wearable blankets that fit according to the commercial manufacturer's guidelines and will not slide up around the infant's face may be used when necessary for the comfort of the sleeping infant, however swaddling shall not be used unless the Home has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing its use for a particular infant that includes instructions and a time frame for swaddling the infant. Staff shall not place objects or allow objects to be placed in or on the crib with an infant such as but not limited to toys, pillows, quilts, comforters, bumper pads, sheepskins, stuffed toys, or other soft items and shall not attach objects or allow objects to be attached to a crib with a sleeping infant such as but not limited to crib gyms, toys, mirrors and mobiles. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that a blanket was observed inside of the pack in playing with a sleeping infant.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure that safe sleep requirements for infants are followed as required.

It was determined based on the consultant's observation that the fencing on the back middle section measured three feet, nine inches, the fencing on the front left measured three feet, ten inches, and the fencing on the front middle measured three feet, ten inches.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will enclose the outside play area(s) with a four-foot high fence or other Department-approved barrier and inspect regularly to ensure fencing material is safe and any hazards identified are repaired or replaced. The Home will install or repair a fence around swimming pools that makes them inaccessible to children.

290-2-3-.10 Kitchen Operations

Finding 290-2-3-.10(10) makes the following requirements for the storage of garbage: 1) garbage must be stored in

trash containers with lids; 2) containers must be emptied and cleaned as needed; 3) areas around the outside containers must be kept clean. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that the storage of garbage requirements were not met in that the container was not emptied and cleaned as needed.
