This Licensing Study is the second regulatory visit for Joyce E. Franke this 2018 - 2019 fiscal year.

The provider currently has a two star Quality Rating.

The provider stated no medication is administered, nofield trips taken and no routine transportation is provided.

The provider stated there are no additional household members and no newly hired staff since the consultant's last visit.

The provider was approved for the 25 square foot January of 2018 to keep two extra children M - F from 1 PM - 3 PM.

The consultant reviewed Ms. Joyce E. Franke CBC and finds that she has a satisfactory comprehensive fingerprint criminal records clearance determination letter on file.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders.
