- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(c) requires that climbing and swinging equipment that are not portable have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment, which is adequately maintained by the Home to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on consultant's observations and measurements that the resilient surface for the three slide and three swing structure on the playground measured as followed:

- * The depth of resilient surfacing at the base of the five (5) foot slide measured four inches when six inches is required.
- * The depth of resilient surfacing at the base of the tube slide measured approximately four (4) to five (5) inches when six (6) inches is required.
- * The depth of the resilient surface located at the base of the third slide measured approximately three (3) to

five (5) inches when six (6) inches is required. * The resilient surfacing for the swings measured four (4) to five (5) inches when six (6) inches is required. Further, there were three swings located in one bay, when no more than two per bay are allowed.

Finding 290-2-313(2)(d) requires that outside play areas be protected from traffic or other hazards by fencing or other barriers at least four feet in height and approved by the Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children. A fence shall be provided around swimming pools to make them inaccessible when not in use. It was determined based on consultant's observations that the fence used for the children's space was not fully enclosing the space and there was a large openings that was leading to the farm land with a chained dog present there. Additionally, it was determined that the fencing material used on one side of the playground measured at three and a half feet, when at least a four feet of approved barrier is required. It was also determined that there was a gap that measured approximately four inches at the bottom of the wooden fence that was facing the farm animals.

Finding 290-2-311(o) requires the Home control pets and other animals to maintain proper sanitation and ensure animals are not a hazard to anyone. No animal that may be vicious is permitted on the premises while children are present. Farm animals cannot be housed within 500 feet of the home. It was determined based on consultant's observation that there were one pig and several chicken that were in the yard immediately behind the wooden fence for the playground for the children.
