Further, from time to time the department discovers additional rule violations during the course of an investigation. If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

## 290-2-3-.14 Required Reporting

#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

290-2-3-.14(1) requires the Home to report to the Department within twenty-four hours or the next work day: any death of a Child while in the care of the Home; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid administered by the Provider, Provisional Employee or Employee of the Home; any fire; any structural disaster; the closing of the Home and any situation when a Child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a Child who is left on a vehicle, a Child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a Child who is left behind on any trip. It was determined during an investigation, that the Home failed to report to the Department within 24 hours, when on June 5, 2019, a one-year-old child sustained a leg injury that required professional medical attention. The Home was made aware of the visit and the child's treatment for a fractured femur.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure a timely report is made to the Department as the licensing rules require.
