- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. #### **Finding**

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) requires that outdoor play areas be kept clean and free of hazards such as exposed sharp corners of concrete or equipment, rust and splinters on equipment, broken glass, open drainage ditches, holes and stagnant water. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were observed to be accessible to the children on the playground area:

- Exposed black tarp surrounding the red, brown, and green "Step 2", the red, brown, and green playhouse, and the two red, blue, green, and white "Little Tikes" sliding structure located at the front right entrance of the playground area.
- Concrete cinder blocks, a propane tank, an unwrapped garden hose, a covered lawn mower, and a barbecue grill were sitting next to the deck located on the front left side of the playground area.
- Aluminum covers, bicycle equipment, wooden planks with exposed nails, a grill, paint buckets, a mop, and a glass shower door were sitting on the deck next to the back door located on the front left side of the playground area.

All items were observed to be accessible to the children.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will repair any and all identified outdoor hazards and will monitor playground daily or more often as needed to ensure that the Home's outdoor play area is kept clean and free of hazards.

A one-day letter was left on this date.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Home will that every actual and potential Provider, Employee and Provisional Employee of a Family Child Care Learning Home submit both a Records Check Application to the Department and Fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site as required. The provider must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The Home will not allow the helper to return until the helper receives a satisfactory comprehensive criminal record check letter to ensure the CRC rules are maintained. The Home submitted the helper's criminal record check application as of Monday, March 11, 2019, and will have the helper complete the fingerprinting process at an authorized fingerprinting site by Tuesday, March 12, 2019.

#### Finding

290-2-3-.21(1)(c) requires every Employee to have a current and valid satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Home while any child is present for care or before residing in the Home if age 17 or older. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on a review of records that the helper hired on January 18, 2019 did not have evidence of a criminal record check letter on file on this date. A one-day letter was left on this date.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Home will ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Home while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Home. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. The provider must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The Home will not allow the helper to return until the helper receives a satisfactory comprehensive criminal record check letter to ensure the CRC rules are maintained. The Home submitted the helper's criminal record check application as of Monday, March 11, 2019, and will have the helper complete the fingerprinting process at an authorized fingerprinting site by Tuesday, March 12, 2019.
