An Administrative Review was conducted on April 12, 2021. Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed. A virtual inspection was conducted on April 30, 2021 with Delceda Neasman. An in-person visit was not conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Compliance with the Executive Order issued on April 8, 2021 was reviewed during the virtual inspection.
