An in-person walkthrough of the facility was conducted on March 10, 2022. A letter requesting documents be uploaded March 17, 2022, for the annual review was left with the director after the walkthrough. The center does provide transportation. Background checks for all staff were reviewed during the walk though visit. The annual review was completed on March 24, 2022, and a copy of the report was emailed to the provider on this day.

Plan of Improvement: No Plan Developed

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

Technical Assistance

The consultant discussed with the director the requirement that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. The director stated she would remove a cracked basket used for storing play cups in the Pre-K classroom and a cracked blue chair in the three-year-old classroom.

Correction Deadline: 3/10/2022

Finding

591-1-1-.12(6) requires that a variety of age-appropriate toys and play materials be available, stored on low, open shelves accessible to children in each room or assigned area. It was determined based on observation that in the two-year-old classroom there were no toys available or stored on the low open shelves.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center director will ensure there is a variety of age-appropriate toys and play materials in each room for each age group, that are stored on low, open shelves accessible to children.

Finding

591-1-1-25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that in the three-year-old classroom there was diaper cream and Vasoline both labeled keep out of reach of children in a child's cubby that was accessible to children in care.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Discussed maintenance of resilient surface. Please fluff and redistribute.

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that on the Large Playground there were the following hazards.

- -There was a tricycle with a cracked seat that posed a pinching hazard.
- -There were two tricycles with broken pedals that exposed the pedal bolts and presented a hazard.
- -The large climbing equipment at the back of the playground had a broken purple section with sharp edges exposed.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Correction Deadline: 3/20/2022

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed on the Large Playground.

- -There was Spanish moss hanging down from trees and accessible to children in care.
- -There were exposed roots at the back gate and the play equipment that presented a tripping hazard.
- -There was a dryer vent on the side of the building that was cracked with sharp edges exposed.

Additionally, on the Toddler Playground there was a concrete slab with an edge that faced the back play area that was of a height that presented a tripping hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(a)3 requires that each crib shall have only an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant. It was determined based on observation that in the Infant classroom there were three cribs with crib sheets that were too tight and caused the corners of the mattresses to curve up presenting a hazard to infants in care.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each crib has an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant.
