 - Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding

591-1-1-.08(1) requires the Center Staff to maintain a file for each child while such child is in care and for one year after that child is no longer enrolled. In order for the file to be complete, the file shall contain the following: child's name, birth date, sex, address, living arrangement, name of school if applicable; names of both Parents, home and work addresses, and home and work telephone numbers; name(s) and addresses of the person(s) to whom the child may be released including address, telephone numbers, relationship to child and to Parent(s), and other identifying information; name(s) and telephone number(s) of person(s) to contact in emergencies when the Parent cannot be reached; name and telephone number of the child's primary source of health care; and a statement regarding known allergies, physical problems, mental health disorders, mental retardation or developmental disabilities which limit the child's participation in the program. It was determined based on review of staff records, the following was not included in children's records: 3 of 5 records did not have the work address for one or both parents, 3 of 5 records did not list if the child had allergies and 1 of 5 records did not include release persons address.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center staff will develop a plan that includes how to obtain all required information for currently enrolled children and how to ensure this is done for future enrollees as well. The plan will also include how and where to maintain files for the required amount of time. The plan will be implemented and followed.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on review of playground on June 6, 2022, the following areas were observed to be in need of repair:

-1 rusted nail located with the sharp end accessible to children on the fence facing the road.

- 1 rusted nail located with the sharp end accessible to children on the back right area of the playground fence.
- 6 1/2 gap measured in the fencing located right outside of classroom A.

Further, located throughout the playground, consultant observed multiple boards that are broken and are in need of repair.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

It was determined based on observation, three twelve-year-old children were observed on the outside playground with one and two-year-old children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide adequate staff when there is a mixed-age group.

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on observation, a two-year-old child was left unattended in Classroom B using a small child size toilet while their class was outside. The staff person in the building was observed to be in Classroom A at the time with the older children. Further, the same staff person was observed to leave those six children ages 7-9-years-old alone in Classroom A to tend to the two-year-old child, helping them wash their hands in Classroom B.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
