- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

290-2-3-.11(2)(f) requires that poisons, medicines, cleaning agents and other hazardous materials be in locked areas or inaccessible to children. It was determined based on a check of the bathroom that the latch under the bathroom sink was not secured where aiax and cleaning products were stored.

To ensure the safe storage of hazardous items, the Home Provider will make these items inaccessible to the children.

## **Technical Assistance**

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) - Please ensure that the grill is completely covered at all times while children are in care. PLEASE adhere to the rules on the label of the trampoline that it should not be used for children under the age of 6 years old.

#### **Finding**

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) requires that outdoor play areas be kept clean and free of hazards such as exposed sharp corners of concrete or equipment, rust and splinters on equipment, broken glass, open drainage ditches, holes and stagnant water. It was determined based on an observation of the playground that:

- A push style lawn mower was accessible to the children in care on the playground.
- -An active ant bed was observed on the playground.
- -The storage shed lacked a latch or lock to ensure that it is kept inaccessible to the children in care.

### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will repair any and all identified outdoor hazards and will monitor playground daily or more often as needed to ensure that the Home's outdoor play area is kept clean and free of hazards.

## **Finding**

290-2-3-.13(2)(d) requires that outside play areas be protected from traffic or other hazards by fencing or other barriers at least four feet in height and approved by the Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children. A fence shall be provided around swimming pools to make them inaccessible when not in use. It was determined based on an observation that the gate on the left side of the yard was observed to be open upon the consultants arrival and her check of the playground. Additionally, I was also determined during the check of the playground that the right gate leading to the outside was not properly latched as it was broken and children could easily tug on the gate and open it.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will enclose the outside play area(s) with a four-foot high fence or other Department-approved barrier and inspect regularly to ensure fencing material is safe and any hazards identified are repaired or replaced. The Home will install or repair the gates leading to the outside.

## 290-2-3-.10 Food Service & Nutrition

#### **Finding**

290-2-3-.10(8) requires that food be served according to manufacturer's instructions and recommendations. Foods that are associated with young children's choking incidents, such as, but not limited to, peanuts, hot dogs, raw carrots, popcorn, fish with bones, cheese cubes, grapes and any other food that is of similar shape and size of the trachea/windpipe shall not be served to the children less than four (4) years of age. Children older than four (4) years of age may be served these foods provided that the foods are cut in such a way as to minimize choking. Food shall not be accessible or served to children until it has been chopped, diced, cut or mashed and is appropriate for each child's age and individual eating, chewing and swallowing ability. It was determined based on an observation that chicken hotdogs were served for lunch today to children under (4) years of age.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will train Staff and monitor food served and accessible to children to ensure that the food does not present a choking hazard.

The Family Child Care Learning Home will submit an application for a Child Care Learning Center and receive a license to operate from the Department before caring for more than six children, related or unrelated, for pay.
