An in person Monitoring Visit was completed on this day. The center director stated there is a total of 13 staff with 5 staff being new hires since the consultant's last visit. The director stated no medication is administered, no field trips or routine transportation is provided. The consultant request documents to be uploaded by close of business, Wednesday, May 18, 2022 for the administrative review.

Plan of Improvement: No Plan Developed

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee
