- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed to be accessible in the following classrooms:

- -C/3L/200: Diaper cream observed in unlocked drawer in the diapering area
- -G/4R/400: Pinesol, Lysol and Wet Ones wipes were observed in a closet on a shelf that is accessible to the children. Also, a stapler and tape dispenser were observed on a counter near the sink and was accessible.
- -I/Center/500: A toilet brush was observed to be accessible in the girl's bathroom.
- -J/4L: A toilet brush was observed in the bathroom on the left. Also, a stapler, scissors and air freshener were observed in an unlocked drawer and a box of Borax was observed in an unlocked cabinet in the area under the counter. Additionally, a tape dispenser was observed accessible on top of the cubbies close to the entrance of the classroom.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.09(1)(c) requires the Center to ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on a review of records that a staff rehired on October 12, 2021 did not have a new satisfactory comprehensive records check determination on file.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Center will ensure to receive a completed a records check determination for staff prior to them being present at the center to ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. The program's owner or an officer/member of the corporation must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The center will review the CRC modules regarding criminal records to ensure the CRC rules are maintained.

It was determined based on a review of records that staff rehired on October 12, 2021 had a lapse in employment for more than 180 calendar days.

The program's owner or an officer/member of the corporation must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date.
