However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an emplovee

O.C.G.A. Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-132(4)(a) requires that during the early morning times of arrival and late afternoon times of depinfants and children younger than three (3) years may be grouped with older children so long as Staff: ratios and group size are met based on the age of the youngest child in the group. It was determined the center failed to maintain staff:child ratios in mixed-aged groups based on the youngest group of children interviews and a review of records confirmed children aged (1), eight-year-old, (1) five-year-old, (1) foul old and (1) ten-month-old were inappropriately housed in an after school room during a time other than hour of arrival and last hour of departure as required.	child hat the en. Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities,
mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the
appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising
in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times,
and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions
of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on the consultant's investigative findings, that a ten-month-old infant was not properly supervised when the infant choked and ingested a foreign object. Supervising center staff failed to provide watchful oversight and confirmed having no knowledge of what the infant ingested. Additionally, center staff failed to ensure that the classroom was free from materials that could be hazardous or cause harm to an infant child in care.
