- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important New Deadlines:

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

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Findings Report

Health and Hygiene

591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.07(5) requires Center Staff to not permit children to wear around their necks or attach to their clothing pacifiers or other hazardous items. It was determined based on investigative findings that on April 27, 2021, the staff members allowed a sixteen-week-old child to sleep in a car seat with a pacifier attached to their person. Investigative findings further revealed that on April 26, 2021 staff members allowed a sixteen-week-old child to sleep in a car seat and a bouncy seat with a pacifier attached to their person for an undetermined length of time.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will instruct Staff regarding this safety requirement. The center will ensure that all pacifiers are not attached to the children's clothing and/or neck to prevent a potential choking hazard. The center removes any pacifiers attached to the children's clothing immediately.

Sleeping & Resting Equipment

591-1-1-.30 Safe Sleeping and Resting Requirements(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.30(2)(c) requires that infants shall not sleep in equipment other than safety-approved cribs, such as, but not limited to, a car safety seat, bouncy seat, highchair, or swing. Infants who arrive at the Center asleep or fall asleep in such equipment, on the floor or elsewhere, shall be transferred to a safety-approved crib. It was determined based on investigative findings that on April 26, 2021 and April 27, 2021, staff members allowed a sixteen-week-old infant to nap in a car seat for an undetermined length of time during morning drop-off. It was further determined that staff members allowed a sixteen-week-old infant to sleep in a bouncy seat for an undetermined length of time.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will only place infants in safe cribs to sleep and will transfer them to a safe crib when the infants are asleep in other equipment. The center no longer allows parents to drop their children off in their car seats. The center ensures that the staff members immediately remove the children from their car seats during drop-off and return the car seats to the parents.
