- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazardous items were accessible to the children present for care during the visit:

- Classroom G Arendelle An unlocked closet located on the front-left side of the classroom contained a red backpack (first aid kit) was sitting on the right side of the closet entry and a staff member's purple purse was hanging on the left-side of the closet with a small bottle of hand sanitizer attached to the purse. A box of gloves (industrial vinyl) and grocery bags were sitting on top of a three drawer black and clear plastic bin and a plunger was observed sitting on the floor next to three bags of diapers located in the first right restroom.
- Classroom F Ashdown Forrest Two tubes of diaper ointment and plastic grocery bags were stored in the first right three drawer black and clear plastic bin, and a black, white, and silver plunger was sitting in a white bucket on the front-left side of the children's restroom. A brown grocery bag containing children's clothing, and a bottle of hand sanitizer was stored in a child's cubby located on the front-right side of the classroom.
- Classroom E Wild Things A box of plastic gloves and several grocery bags were stored in a three drawer black and clear plastic bin located on the front-left entrance of the back-left restroom. A bottle of "Aquaphor," diapering ointment, and a grocery bag was stored in several children's cubbies located on the front-left side of the classroom.
- Classroom D Hundred Acre Woods Diaper ointment, suncreen, and a travel size bottle of lotion was stored in a child's backpack in the cubby area located on the front-right entry of the classroom.
- Classroom C Wonderland A tube of lotion was stored in a child's backpack in the cubby area located on the front-left side of the classroom.

Several of the items contained the label "KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN."

It was determined based on observation that a bottle of "Concentrated Ibuprofen" was stored in a child's backpack located on the front-left side entrance of classroom C - Wonderland.
