If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazardous items were observed to be accessible to the children present for care during the visit:

- Classroom B: 2R - A bottle of "Off Kids Insect Repellent Spray," "Parent's Choice Diaper Rash Ointment," and

"Aquaphor Ointment" were stored in several children's cubbies located on the front-right side of the classroom. - Classroom C: 3R - A plunger, mop, and a toilet brush were sitting next to the toilet inside the restroom located on the front-right side of the classroom across from the diaper changing table. A bottle of "Aquaphor Ointment," "Vaseline," and four packs of wipes were stored in several children's cubbies located on the front-left side of the classroom.

- Classroom D: 4R - Two containers of "Aquaphor Ointment" and 10 packs of wipes were stored in an unlocked cabinet underneath the diaper changing table located on the back-left side of the classroom. A tube of "Desitin Diapering Ointment," eight packs of wipes, two bottles of "Vaseline," a bottle of "Aveeno Baby Lotion," and a tube of "Dr. Talbot's Soothing Gel" were stored in several children's cubbies located on the front left-side of the classroom.

- Classroom K: 1L - A tube of "Think Baby Sunscreen," "Cortizone-10 Eczema Ointment," "Desitin Diapering Ointment," and four packs of wipes were stored in several children's cubbies located on the front-right side of the classroom.

- Classroom E: 5R - A mop bucket and a mop were sitting in the restroom located on the back-right side of the classroom.

All items contained the label "KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN."

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Correction Deadline: 3/7/2023

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that the light fixture and ventilation combo was not covered exposing the light bulb located in the second-left restroom located on the back-left side of classroom G: 5L. Further observation revealed that three window screens adjacent to classrooms A: 1R and C: 3R were torn exposing the glass window facing playground C - RS (6wks - 3 yrs).

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

- Biting and/or stinging insects (i.e., ant mounds, bees, etc.).

- Normal wear and tear of the fence surrounding the playground areas.
- Standing water in and/or around playground equipment and toys.

Per the director, the large playground structure located on playground B is currently under construction. The consultant discussed ensuring that the children do not have access to the playground equipment until construction is completed.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation that the fall zones surrounding the green, red, blue, tan, and orange sliding structure located on playground B - LB/B (2yr-12yr) contained approximately one-inch of resilient surface. Further observation revealed that the fall zones surrounding the purple, blue, yellow, and red sliding structure contained approximately one-inch of resilient surface located on playground C - RS (6wks-3yrs). Approximately six-inches of resilient surface was required around the fall zones of each sliding structure.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency.

Finding

591-1-1-.20(1) requires Personnel to obtain specific written authorization from the child's physician or parent in order to dispense prescription or non-prescription medications, except for first aid. Such authorization will include when applicable, date; full name of the child; name of the medication; prescription number, if any; dosage; the dates to be given; the time of day to be dispensed; and signature of parent. It was determined based on review of records that the center did not have documentation of the start date and end date to administer "Albuterol HFA." Further review of records revealed that the center did not have documentation of the scheduled time to administer "Albuterol HFA."

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to obtain and review parental authorizations to ensure the authorization contains complete information. The designated person(s) will monitor daily. The center will ensure that the parents document the start date, end date, and times to administer all medications.

Finding

591-1-1-.20(4) requires the Center to keep medication in a cabinet or container that is locked or otherwise not accessible to the children and to be stored separate from cleaning chemicals, supplies or poisons. Medications requiring refrigeration shall be placed in a leak-proof container in a refrigerator that is not accessible to the children. It was determined based on observation that a prescription for "Hydrocortisone 2.5% Cream" was stored in a child's cubby located on the front-left side of classroom C: 3R.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff on the safe and proper storage of medication and monitor to ensure that the rule is met.

591-1-1.21(3) requires that the Center conduct drills for fire, tornado and other emergency situations. The fire drills will be conducted monthly and tornado and other emergency situation drills will be conducted every six months. The Center shall maintain documentation of the dates and times of these drills for two years. It was determined based on review of records that the center did not complete two lockdown drills for the year 2022.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will hold the drills as required and keep the documentation of the drills on file for two years. The center will complete fire drills monthly and tornado drills and lockdown drills every six-months.

The correct number of mats, sheets and blankets were observed on this date. Cleaning and disinfecting of mats was discussed with the director on this date.

Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(a)2 requires that a crib mattress is firm, tight-fitting without gaps, at least 2 inches thick and covered with a waterproof, washable material. Before a change of occupant, each mattress shall be cleaned with a disinfectant. It was determined based on observation that the second-right crib mattress and the third-right crib mattress was torn with exposed foam.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that a crib mattress is firm, tight-fitting without gaps, at least two inches think and covered with a waterproof, washable material. The center will also ensure to replace the two torn crib mattress and continue to monitor the mattresses for normal wear and tear.
