### Advisement of Potential for Repeated Rule Violations during Pending Investigations

However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-125(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be storarea inaccessible to children. It was determined during an investigation that on December 3, 2 year-old child handled a potentially hazardous glass pitcher. The child was carrying the pitche fountain when the child dropped the pitcher causing it to break. As a result, the child sustained the arm that required professional medical treatment and 27 stitches.	021, a three- r to the water

# **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined during an investigation, that on December 3, 2021, there was a lack of watchful oversight when a three-year-old child walked approximately 30 feet, unsupervised, to the water fountain to refill a pitcher. The glass pitcher broke and the child sustained multiple cuts to their arm. Professional medical treatment was required and the child received 27 stitches.
