Advisement of Potential for Repeated Rule Violations during Pending Investigations

During this investigation period, any violations of an identical rule or rules will require the department to treat any and all substantiated rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violation(s).

Further, from time to time the department discovers additional rule violations during the course of an investigation. If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.



Please refer to the website, <http://www.dec.al.ga.gov/CCS/RulesAndRegulations.aspx>, for information regarding October 1, 2018 rule changes about Criminal Records Checks that may affect your facility. In summary,

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 1) Log into DECAL KOALA www.decalkoala.com with the userid for your program
- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Health and Hygiene

591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.07(2) requires that Parents be immediately notified and specific instructions obtained until the child can be picked up or returned to the group, immediately when professional medical attention is required, or when the child experiences symptoms of moderate discomfort, or when the child is involved in an incident that puts their health and/or safety at risk and to notify Parents by the end of the day when professional medical attention is not required, when the child experiences symptoms of less than moderate discomfort or when the child experiences an adverse reaction to prescribed medication which does not constitute moderate discomfort. It was determined based on an investigation that on December 2, 2025, at approximately 7:26 a.m., one staff member transported 13 school-aged children on the center's vehicle to local elementary schools. The vehicle returned to the center at 8:20 a.m., and a 7-year-old child remained unattended on the vehicle for approximately 55 minutes. The child's parent was not notified immediately upon discovery that the child had been left on the vehicle.

Safety

591-1-1-.36 Transportation(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(10) requires that a child never be left unattended in a vehicle. It was determined based on an investigation and self-report that on December 2, 2025, one staff member transported 13 school-aged children in the center's vehicle to local elementary schools. A 7-year-old child remained unattended on the vehicle for approximately 55 minutes after falling asleep during morning transportation. Professional Medical attention was not obtained.

Correction Deadline: 1/12/2026

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(c)2. requires that the driver or other designated person shall immediately document in writing, with a check or other mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist each time a child enters and exits the vehicle. The driver or other designated staff person shall document in writing with a different mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist who was not present on the vehicle for any reason. An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based on an investigation that on December 2, 2025, a staff member inaccurately completed the transportation checklist, indicating that all children had exited the vehicle when a 7-year-old child had not. Professional medical attention was not obtained.

Correction Deadline: 1/12/2026

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(d)1. requires that the first check be conducted immediately upon unloading the last child at any location including, but not limited to, a field trip destination, arrival at the Center, and the last stop during transportation to home or school. The responsible person on the vehicle shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; sign the passenger transportation checklist (s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle; and give the passenger transportation checklist(s) to the second designated Staff person. It was determined based on an investigation and self-report that on December 2, 2025, one staff member transported 13 school-aged children in the center's vehicle to local elementary schools. The staff failed to conduct the first check of the vehicle immediately after unloading the last child at the last stop, as required. As a result, a 7-year-old child remained unattended on the vehicle for approximately 55 minutes. Professional medical attention was not obtained.

Correction Deadline: 1/12/2026

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on an investigation and self-report that on December 2, 2025, one staff member transported 13 school-aged children in the center's vehicle to local elementary schools. The staff failed to conduct the second check of the vehicle immediately after unloading the last child at the last stop, as required. As a result, a 7-year-old child remained unattended on the vehicle for approximately 55 minutes. Professional medical attention was not obtained.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on an investigation and self-report that on December 2, 2025, one staff member transported 13 school-aged children in the center's vehicle to local elementary schools. The vehicle completed five stops before returning to the center, and a 7-year-old child who had fallen asleep remained unattended on the vehicle for approximately 55 minutes. The vehicle was parked in front of the building; the child exited and was discovered by a staff member. Professional medical attention was not obtained.

Correction Deadline: 1/12/2026
