**Advisement of Potential for Repeated Rule Violations during Pending Investigations**

During this investigation period, any violations of an identical rule or rules will require the department to treat any and all substantiated rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violation(s).

Further, from time to time the department discovers additional rule violations during the course of an investigation. If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute

- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

#### Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.37(e) requires the Center shall not make or condone any Staff to make a false or misleading statement to the Department in connection with any authorized investigation or inspection being conducted by the Department. It was determined based on the investigation, that staff statements and interviews gave misleading and false statements. Staff statements stated that after reviewing the video footage, they did not witness the staff member putting the child's shirt over the chair. The staff statements further revealed that the staff member picked the child up, sat the child down, and fixed the child's shirt. The video footage revealed that the staff put the child's shirt over the chair and walked away while the child was screaming. The staff member came back over to the child, asking the child if they were going to listen. The child said, "No!" The staff member fixed the child's shirt and then put the child in reflection time.

The Center will not make, or condone Staff to make false or misleading statements to the Department.

**Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.11(2) requires that Personnel not: physically or sexually abuse a child or engage or permit others to engage in sexually overt conduct in the presence of any child enrolled in the Center; inflict corporal/physical punishment upon a child; shake, jerk, pinch or handle a child roughly; verbally abuse or humiliate a child which includes, but is not limited to, the use of threats, profanity or belittling remarks about a child or his family; isolate a child in a dark room, closet or unsupervised area; use mechanical or physical restraints or devices to discipline children; use medication to discipline or control children's behavior without written medical authorization issued by a licensed professional and given with the parent's written consent; restrict unreasonably a child from going to the bathroom; punish toileting accidents; force-feed a child or withhold feeding a child regularly scheduled meals and/or snacks; force or withhold naps; allow children to discipline or humiliate other children; or confine a child for disciplinary purposes to a swing, highchair, infant carrier, walker or jump seat. It was determined based on staff interviews, statements, and a review of video footage that the allegation on July 15, 2025, at approximately 8:26 a.m. center staff roughly grabbed a 3-year-old child by the upper left arm and pushed the child into a chair, and pulled the back of the child's shirt over the chair as a form of discipline for throwing crayons on the floor, is substantiated. There is a preponderance of evidence to prove this allegation to be true. A review of center video footage revealed that a 3-year-old child threw a piece of paper, crayons, and a cup off the table onto the floor during art time. The staff member could be heard asking the child to pick up the piece of paper, crayons, and cup, but the child refused by screaming, "no!" The video footage further revealed that the staff member verbally threatened the child several times. The staff could be heard saying, "you are not going to be able to see flamingo. You are not playing when we go outside. You'll sit on the fence the entire time. I am going to tell your mommy that you are being bad, and she is not going to take you to the zoo. I am throwing your picture away." The staff asked the child several times to sit down and when the child continued to refuse, the staff member put the piece of paper on the table, grabbed the child's upper left arm and roughly sat the child down on a red chair. The staff member then pulled the back of the child's shirt over the red chair and walked away from the child. The child was observed screaming and began taking their right arm out the top of the shirt. The staff member walked over to the child and placed their arm back into the shirt. The staff then asked the child if they were going to listen, and the child screamed, "no!" The staff member picked up the child and walked them over to the corner for time out.

**POI (Plan of Improvement)**

The Center will take immediate action to ensure the action/conduct has ceased; train/review appropriate child guidance techniques with center staff; and have a system in place to monitor and identify inappropriate actions.
