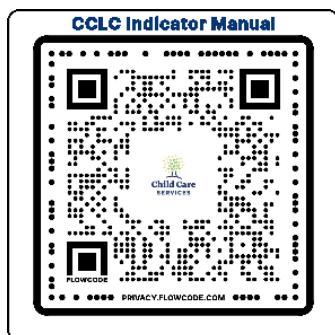

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

The previous citation was observed corrected on this day. Classroom B 114 and J 106 had provided accessibility for cubby storage to the age being served.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(7) requires that doors to rooms not approved for child care, other than the kitchen doors, be latched or locked so children cannot wander into those areas. Except in School-age Centers, interior Center door locks shall permit Personnel to open the locked room from outside of the room in an emergency. It was determined based on observation that Playground B had the riser room and electrical room unlocked, posing a hazard that was accessible to children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check that doors to unapproved rooms remain latched or locked and that Staff can open the locked rooms in an emergency.

Discussed maintenance of resilient surface. Please fluff and redistribute.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the following playgrounds fencing had entrapment hazards:

Playground B 2 R

- The back left side gate had a 5-inch gap at the bottom.

Playground C -1L

The exit gate towards the parking lot had a 5-inch gap at the bottom and a 4- inch gap in between the fencing.

Playground E-3L

-The back bottom gate had two 4-inch gap and a 5-inch gap at the bottom.

-Had a 5.5-inch gap on the top of the entry gate to Playground F-Back.

-Fifteen protruding bolts on the fence exit to Playground D 2L

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Playground A 2 R

***The turquoise blue metal house chipped paint, rust and cracked metal around the bottom of all four sides were repaired.**

Playground E-3L

***The blue metal house chipped paint throughout, cracked metal at the top left metal bar, a tarp across the top with a hole and frayed ends on the left top side, The "S" hooks on all four swing sets were repaired.**

Playground F-Back

***The "S" hooks on all four swing sets on both the blue and green swing bays were repaired.**

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following were accessible to children on the playground and posed a hazard:

Playground B 2 R

- Exposed tree roots at the back left corner.
- One kid pool
- One water hose
- Four fence poles with exposed concrete on left side of the fence

Playground D-2L

- Exposed tree roots along the back fence on the left side and the middle fence between this playground and playground E-3L.
- Three kid pools
- One water hose

Playground F-Back

- Exposed tree roots throughout.

Playground E-3L

- *Exposed tree roots along the back fence on the left side, on the left side of the large orange play set and the middle fence between this playground and playground F-Back.
- Four out of four swings had rusted 'S' hooks
- One out of four had rusted swing chains.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.10(4) requires that if diapers are changed on a diaper changing surface, the surface shall be smooth, nonporous, and equipped with a guard or rails to prevent falls. Between each diaper change, the diaper changing surface shall be cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single-use disposable towel. It was determined based on observation that Building A Room B-2nd R 2 year old had tears on the changing surface which posed an contamination hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure there is a smooth, nonporous changing surface that has a guard or rails for safety in each classroom that houses children wearing diapers. Center Staff will be trained and have adequate supplies to properly clean the diaper changing surface between each diaper change.

It was determined based on review of records that Staff #1 hire date of 04/11/2025 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and pediatric first aid training had expired on June 6,2026 and was present in the room with four 3-year-old children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Director will schedule and/or position caregiver Staff throughout the Center to ensure at least one currently pediatric CPR and First Aid trained Staff person is present in each classroom where children are present.

591-1-1-.32(2) requires the Center maintain Staff:child ratios in mixed-age groups based on the age of the youngest group of children that includes more than twenty percent of the total number of children in the mixed-age group. It was determined based on observations that Building A Room F-6th R Afterschool had a staff child ratio 1:14 among 2 two-year-olds, 4 three-year-olds, 3 four-year-olds, 1 five-year-old and 4 six and up when a ratio of 1:10 was required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide adequate staff when there is a mixed-age group.

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on observation that Building A Room F-6th R Afterschool was not seated within an arm's length away from two 2-year-olds eating breakfast.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
