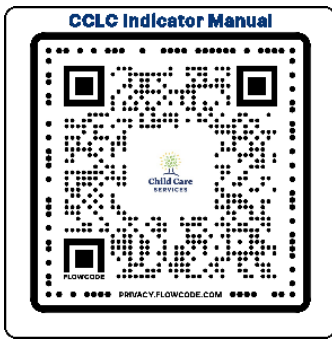

- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

It was determined based on observation that in Classroom B-Right Room, there were four (4) containers that were used to store toys, cracked and had exposed sharp edges. In addition, on the shelf beside the kitchen, there was one container that was used to store toys, cracked and had exposed edges.

It was determined based on observation in Classroom B-Right Class, there was 27 children present and only two tables and sixteen chairs allowing only 16 children to sit at eat lunch. Children were observed having to take turns sitting at the tables to eat lunch.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(2) requires the center to provide at least one hundred square feet of outside play space for each child using the space at one time. It was determined based on observation that when the Consultant arrived at 9:40 a.m., they observed 38 children ages 2-year to 12-years-old on the playground while the capacity on the playground is 20.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation the top of the fencing located in the middle of the fence beside the driveway had a loose wire sticking out at the top and the fencing needed to be re-attached to the metal pole.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation the following hazards:

- * The path leading to the playground has indoor/outdoor grass that had become unattached from the boards and rolled up posing a tripping hazard to the children.
- * Vines and weeds growing through the fence along fencing to the right and left of the gate to the playground.
- * Several black tarps and indoor/outdoor grass were observed uncovered around the equipment posing a tripping hazard to the children
- * An old high chair and a mop and bucket were sitting right outside the door leading to the playground.
- * The top of wood railing located beside the asphalt was observed to be split, exposing splintered wood to the children.
- * The exposed concrete at the gate which can cause a tripping hazard.
- * Exposed tree roots located in front of the gate after entering the playground.

Flush sinks shall not be used for hand washing. Cleansing procedures in other facilities shall be approved by the Department. It was determined d based on observation and discussion with center staff, the portable sink located beside the changing table in Classroom A, was not operable. Center staff stated that they use the bathroom located in across the classroom to wash hands after diapering.

It was determined based on review of Staff records, five out of seven staff were missing a current and valid certification in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). It was determined based on observation that center staff in Classroom B had a staff member present and their was no documentation to confirm they had a current and valid pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and pediatric first aid training certification while caring for the children and the Staff that does help in Classroom B had an expired pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation on file.

591-1-1-.32(2) requires the Center maintain Staff:child ratios in mixed-age groups based on the age of the youngest group of children that includes more than twenty percent of the total number of children in the mixed-age group. It was determined based on observation, one (1) Staff member was caring for 27 children with the following ages: three-3-year-old, four (4) 4-year-olds, six (6) 5-year-olds and fourteen (14) 6-year to 12-year-olds. Based on the twenty percent rule, the staff:child ratio should have been one (1) Staff with twenty (20) children.

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on observation, that when the Consultant arrived, they observed two (2) out of three (3) Staff sitting at the table on the playground on looking down at their cell phones.
